Call for Applications

Prospective Editorial Board members:

- Must be nominated by a current BSA member
- Must become BSA members on election and maintain membership throughout the term.
- Must have experience of being published in refereed journals
- Must have refereed a minimum of three articles for a peer-review journal
- Should not be members of the editorial board of more than one BSA journal at a time.

The board welcomes applications involving any areas of methodological, theoretical and empirical expertise, though board members with expertise in the following areas are particularly welcome:

- Quantitative research
- Gender and work, particularly female labour market participation
- Labour market policy
- Generalists
- Unemployment/job insecurity

Please Note:

- The editorial board meets twice a year.
- The BSA will reimburse editorial board members for all reasonable UK travel costs incurred as a direct result of their attendance at board meetings
- Former board members may stand for a second consecutive term but cannot reapply again for 2 years after the 2nd term.
- No more than two board members from the same institution may be on the board at any one time. (see list of board members)
