Prospective Editorial Board members:

- Must be nominated by a current BSA member
- Members of the WES editorial board are required to be members of the BSA. Whilst this is not a condition for nomination new members would be expected to join on their election.
- Must have experience of being published in refereed journals
- Must have refereed a minimum of three articles for a peer-review journal
- Should not be members of the editorial board of more than one BSA journal at a time.

Applications can involve any areas of methodological, theoretical and empirical expertise though board members with expertise in quantitative methods, gender, labour markets, skills and work organization are particularly welcome. In addition, the board would benefit from members with a general understanding of the sociology of work and employment.

Please note:

- The board welcomes applications that reflect the full diversity of BSA membership.
- The editorial board meets twice a year in London.
- The BSA will reimburse editorial board members for all reasonable UK travel costs incurred as a direct result of their attendance at board meetings.
- Former board members can stand for two consecutive terms but cannot reapply for membership until two years have passed since they last served on the board.
- We do not allow more than two board members from the same institution on the board at any one time. Please see information on current board members to the right.
