Following the success of our previous methods workshops in 2014, we are holding another one day workshop. In response to expressions of interest, the first session will focus on applied and policy-related food research. Food has a high policy profile at present and much research is being commissioned by government and other agencies. We will explore what makes this research different and how to do it well. The second session examines the range of exciting new visual and mobile methods developed for food research. Both sessions will be facilitated by experienced social scientists currently or recently working in these fields.

The event is aimed at Postgraduate Research Students and Early Career researchers, but may also be useful for those working outside academia, including practitioners.

The day will also include plenty of time for networking and a group discussion on critical issues arising from the workshops.
