## **BSA Early Career Annual Conference Fund**

The BSA Early Career Forum allocates **funding of up to £500 each to 4 BSA members.** Applicants must be fully paid BSA members, and must also have had an abstract accepted for presentation at the BSA Annual Conference and must not have been awarded your PhDs more than 7 years ago.

Members are limited to one claim for the BSA Annual Conference – if you have previously received funds, you are not eligible. **Funding** will be awarded by random selection and the closing date for applications is 12 noon on Monday, 8 January 2017. All applicants will be informed of the allocations on Tuesday, 9 January 2017.

## Eligibility Criteria

- You must be a fully paid member of the BSA
- You must not be eligible for the BSA Support Fund
- You must have had an abstract accepted for presentation at the BSA Annual Conference
- You must not have been awarded your PhD more than 7 years ago.

## How to claim:

Applicants should send an e-mail to <a href="mailto-events@britsoc.org.uk">events@britsoc.org.uk</a> with the subject line: BSA ECF Conference Fund Application. The e-mail should include:

- Your full name
- Your BSA membership number
- The date your PhD was awarded, and the name of the awarding institution
- Type of conference registration required i.e. Full conference £335 or Day registration £150
- Dietary requirements
- Any access or other requirements
- Your e-mail address and institution name for the delegate list

If successful, your conference registration will be processed for you and confirmation will be sent to you by e-mail. You will also be informed how to claim back the remaining balance to fund your other conference expenses (e.g. accommodation, travel, refreshments).
