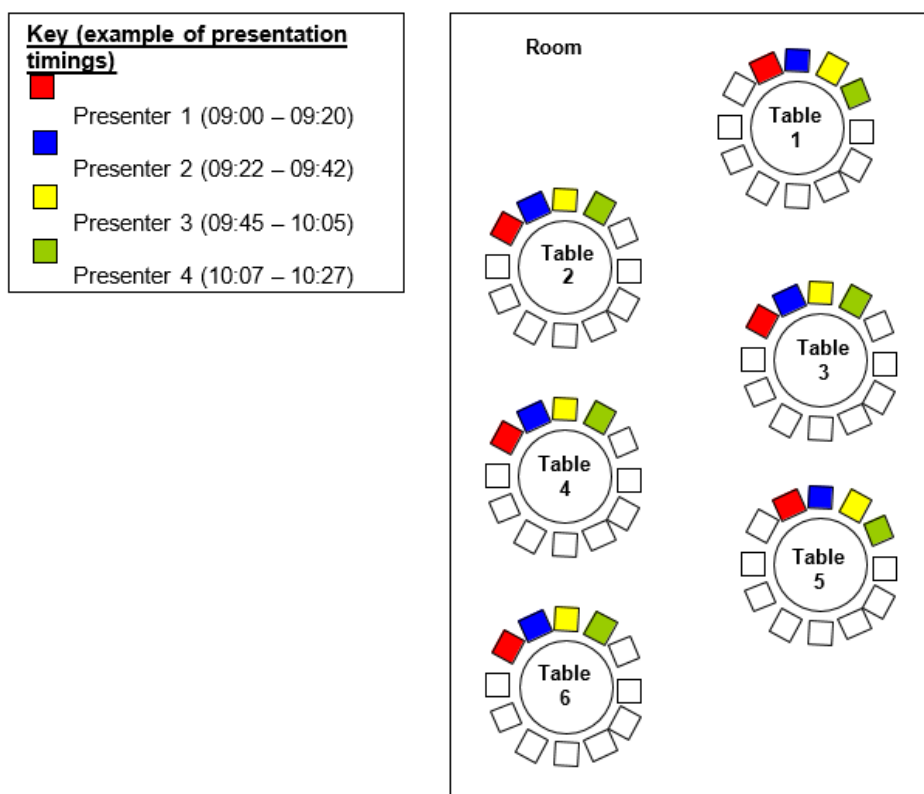

Roundtables (250 word count limit)

For experienced presenters and newcomers alike, roundtables offer a more informal setting to promote discussion and encourage feedback.

As is usual practice at some larger conferences, roundtable sessions are where a number of presentations are given simultaneously at separate tables within a single room. Each table will have a session chair and the papers allocated to it will be grouped by topic areas. Each of the four papers within the roundtable will be allocated a 20 minute slot (15 minutes presentation followed by 5 minutes questions).

PowerPoint is not available for use during the roundtable sessions.



Feedback from previous roundtable sessions:

- “Really enjoyed this - more interactive, and helped with networking/putting names to faces. Also less nerve- wracking for some colleagues.”
- “Attending (and presenting) at the theory roundtable, I was extremely excited about the discussion, which allowed for more direct conversation as in usual presentations.
