- To host scholarly activities, including seminars and workshops, around new materialist sociology, research methodologies and the development of new materialist social theory.
- To provide a supportive environment and resources for PGR and ECR members of the Association who wish to use these approaches in their research.
- To plan contributions to future BSA annual conferences, regional BSA meetings and free-standing events, and to collaborate and engage with other relevant BSA study groups (e.g. Animal/Human; Disability; Theory).

Review of past year

In-person Day Conference

The Group ran a one-day conference on 24 March 2024 at Goldsmith's University of London on the theme *Sociology and the New Materialisms*. This was our first face-to-face event since the Sars-Cov-2 pandemic. The keynote speaker was Professor EJ Renold (Cardiff University). This was followed by a programme of nine member presentations, selected from 18 responses to an open call for abstracts. These included early career academics, current PhD students and overseas scholars. There were approximately 30 delegates in attendance.

Online Seminar series

Once again, the group ran a very well-attended international seminar series in 2024 using the BSA's Zoom facility.

Seminar 3 (19 November 2024) 'Animating the material politics of citizenship' Professor Anna Hickey-Moody (Maynooth University, Republic of Ireland)

The group ran a very successful day conference in June 2025, and we are now finalising our online seminar series for autumn 2025. It was the Group's turn to convene the Theory stream at BSA Annual Conference 2025. (To be reported in 2025 annual return).
